Details

ECC maintained and published on its website non-binding but informal documents mirroring the contract specification of all products for which ECC serves as central counterparty or settlement link. These documents named “Clearing Specifications” and “ECC Product Information” will not be provided any longer on the ECC website.

Please note that each partner exchange publishes on its respective website the sole legally binding documentation of the contract specification of its tradable products, cleared by ECC.

In addition, ECC continues to provide technical clearing-related details about cleared instruments which are available in the technical documentation under <https://www.ecc.de/en/member-section/product-specification-files>.

The following documents will still be available on the ECC website:

Document	Content

The old ECC Clearing Specification documents will henceforth not be updated anymore and moved to an archive on ECC’s website.
